TROOP 66 CAMPERSHIP PROGRAM

Dear Parents and Guardians,

In 2008, the troop committee established a troop campership fund. Its purpose is to offer scouts who need financial assistance up to 50% payment of campouts for the year with a cap of \$250.00 per scout, per year. \$1,500.00 is to be set aside annually to be used for camperships if funds are available. Additionally, any closed scout account money that is donated back to the troop will also be used for this fund. In administering the funds, great care will be exercised in order that only Scouts who need and deserve financial assistance shall be aided and that all information gathered to identify this need will be held in the strictest confidence. Details shall be handled in such a way as to cause no embarrassment to the Scout or his family. Other assistance for some activities may be available through the Northeast Illinois Council or other sources via a separate application process. Funds are limited and there is no guarantee that a troop and/or council campership will be awarded. Combined troop and council camperships, if awarded, will not exceed 75% of the total costs or camping fees.

Council Camperships

The purpose of the Jones-Springer-Morris Campership is to assist Northeast Illinois Scouts in need with meeting the financial requirements for a council-sponsored summer camping experience.

The total amount given will be based on need and available funds. The Council Scout Outdoor Committee will make every effort to honor requests. Unit scout leaders (Scoutmaster) should screen and sign applications before they get to the Outdoor Committee. The application deadline for all Cub and Scout council camping programs is April 15th. Applications can be downloaded from the NEIC.org website or upon request from the unit scout leader. If awarded, the Scoutmaster will be notified prior to the event.

Troop Camperships

The purpose of the Troop 66 Campership Program is to help provide financial support to Scouts who would otherwise be financially unable to fully experience Scouting with costs exceeding \$100 (i.e.: to purchase scout uniforms/equipment, attend campouts, hikes, in- or out-of council summer camp or high adventure programs.)

Troop Camperships are awarded based on a combination of factors, which include financial hardship, the Scout's attendance and participation, and the parent's or guardian's reasonable participation in supporting Troop activities. All applicants will be expected to: actively participate in troop-sponsored fundraisers to help earn funds in keeping with the Scout Law of "A Scout is Thrifty," and to participate in troop service projects in keeping with the Scout Law of "A Scout is Helpful."

Furthermore, the parent or guardian will be asked to provide reasonable participation at Troop activities as a condition of awarding Camperships for their Scout(s).

Requests must be made in writing using the attached form. The Troop Campership Committee, which will consist of the Troop Committee Chairman, the Scoutmaster, and the Troop Treasurer will meet and evaluate all requests within 14 days of the fees closing date.

Parent(s)/guardian(s) are responsible for any fee(s) if a campership is awarded, but the Scout does not attend a selected activity except for reasons of a emergency. The parent(s)/guardian(s) are requested to pay their portion of the fees for the selected activity not less than 14 days prior to fees closing date for the event. This portion being the cost of the activity minus the campership amount requested.

If a campership is not awarded or if a campership is not accepted, any previous payment(s) made will be credited to the Scout's account.
